Primary student use of mobile phones and personal devices

Purpose

This policy provides direction to students, staff and families about managing mobile phones and other digital devices that students choose to bring to school. Digital devices include, but are not limited to, smartwatches, tablets or laptops that are not part of a separate Bring Your Own Device arrangement. This policy applies while students are at school, or attending an authorised school activity such as an excursion, during school hours.

Mobile phone use for primary school students

The department's position is that primary aged students cannot use their mobile phones and personal devices at school during school hours. The department and the school recognise that there are legitimate reasons for students to bring a mobile phone or personal device to school. This may include:

- to ensure their safety while travelling
- so that parents can contact them outside of school hours.

During the school day, students are not permitted to access or use their mobile phones or other personal devices. Students must switch off or mute their devices before storing them at the beginning of the school day. They will not be able to access their device until the end of the school day.

The school does not accept responsibility for theft, loss, damage or health effects (potential or actual) resulting from mobile phone use.

Storage of personal devices

Students are encouraged **NOT** to bring mobile phones to school. The school does not accept responsibility for theft, loss, damage or health effects (potential or actual) resulting from mobile phone use. Phones brought to school are required to be kept in the student's locker/ bag. Phones are not to be used/ played with during the school day.

If the student does not comply

Students who are not able to comply with expectation will be reminded of the school policy and the phone will be confiscated. The phone will be stored in and can be collected from the Front Office at the end of the day.

A repeat offence will require the parent/guardian to collect the phone. The parent will be contacted by the school. Any repeat offences from this occurrence will be managed in accordance with the School's behaviour management policy.

Roles and responsibilities

Principal

Ensures:

- this policy is clearly communicated and accessible to all students, staff, and families
- there is a process for regular review of the policy
- secure storage is provided for student personal devices that are handed in to school staff
- processes are in place for monitoring internet and school network use by all members of the school community.

Enforce the policy and responses to instances of non-compliance.

Report and respond to incidents of inappropriate use of personal devices in line with department policy and procedures and any legislative requirements.

Consider requests for exemptions from the policy sought by parents on a case-by-case basis. Make sure that approved exemptions are documented and that relevant staff are informed about students' exemptions.

Model appropriate use of mobile phones and support families to understand the importance of promoting safe, responsible and respectful use of mobile phones to their children.

School staff

Deliver learning opportunities and maintain a safe and productive learning environment. Take steps to minimise distractions from the non-educational use of personal devices in the learning environment at times when a student in line with an approved exemption or in circumstances is using a device where students' devices are stored in the classroom.

Respond to instances of non-compliance in line with the school's policy.

Report and respond to incidents of inappropriate use of personal devices in line with department policy and procedures and any legislative requirements.

Make sure that any student personal devices handed in for their care are stored in a secure location and are returned to the student (or their parent).

Model appropriate use of mobile phones and support families to understand the importance of promoting safe, responsible and respectful use of mobile phones to their children.

Staff may use a mobile phone in an emergency.

Students

Comply with the requirements of the school's policy, follow all reasonable directions from the Principal, and school staff.

If permitted to use a mobile phone or personal device [through exemption application] in line with an exemption under this policy, do so in a safe, responsible and respectful way and support peers to do the same.

Communicate respectfully with others and do not use a mobile phone or other personal device to bully, harass or threaten another person.

Respect others' rights to privacy and do not take photos, film or audio records of other people without their knowledge or permission.

Parents

Support the implementation of the school's policy, including the consequences for non-compliance with the policy.

Use the school's formal communication channels in all instances to communicate with the school (including where a student requires early collection from school). Encourage their child to always report to a school staff member in the first instance if they become unwell or experience an issue at school.

Recognise the important role they play in supporting their child to use their mobile phone (or other personal device) in a safe, responsible and respectful way.

Communication and review

Outline:

- Consultation has been undertaken with staff, students and the Governing Council regarding storage of students' devices and what actions will be taken if students do not comply with the policy.
- Consultation will occur when it is time to review these local decisions and ensure the school community members are aware of the policy requirements
